1. Proposition One (Constitutional Right to Reproductive Freedom) on the ballot this November goes far beyond the *Roe* and *Casey* decisions and allows unlimited and unregulated abortion, prohibiting any future laws regulating abortion by altering the state's constitution: SEC. 1.1. The state shall not deny or interfere with an individual's reproductive freedom in their most intimate decisions, which includes their fundamental right to choose to have an abortion and their fundamental right to choose or refuse contraceptives. This section is intended to further the constitutional right to privacy guaranteed by Section 1, and the constitutional right to not be denied equal protection guaranteed by Section 7. Nothing herein narrows or limits the right to privacy or equal protection.

Legal experts agree this would permit and allow state funding and promotion of all abortions and prohibit any regulations of it. The average Californian strongly disagrees with such unlimited abortion policies
